WHAT IS RURAL INTERVENTION CASE MANAGEMENT?

The RISC program was created in collaboration with the 18th Judicial District Juvenile Assessment Center (JAC) and Colorado Youth Detention Continuum (CYDC) to fill different roles that meet the needs of our community. The RISC Case Manager works with youth and families to provide comprehensive assessments, supervision, mentoring, case planning, and connections to resources as needed. This program aims to provide early intervention to address needs and concerns, while avoiding further involvement in the juvenile justice or human service systems.

Referrals to the RISC Case Manager typically come from school professionals, municipal court, district court, or parents/guardians.

WHEN TO MAKE A REFERRAL:

If the youth is experiencing one or more of the following:

- Disruptive behavior
- Fighting
- Behavioral Concerns
- Suspensions/Expulsions
- Academic Disengagement
- Chronic Absences/Truancy
- Violence or Aggression
- Excessive Office Referrals
